PERFECTLY PATRIOTIC

RED, WHITE AND BLUE TRIFLE

Ingredients:

- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 8 ounces sour cream
- 1/4 teaspoon almond flavoring
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 pint whipping cream
- 1 angel food cake (store bought is fine)
- 1 quart strawberries
- 1 quart blueberries
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons almond flavoring



Directions:

Cream together cream cheese and confectioner's sugar. Add sour cream, vanilla and 1/4 tsp almond flavoring. Set this mixture aside. In separate bowl whip the whipping cream and add to cream cheese mixture. Tear prepared angel food cake into bite-sized pieces and add to mixture. In separate bowl (s) place strawberries and blueberries 3/4 cup sugar and 3 Tbsp almond flavoring. (You can mix the berries together or keep separate, for a pretty red, white and blue look, if separate divide sugar and almond flavoring between the two bowls).

In a clear glass bowl alternate layers of the cream cheese mixtures and the berries. Garnish the top with berries. Refrigerate for a couple of hours. This looks absolutely beautiful and tastes just as great! Peaches work really well with this as well.

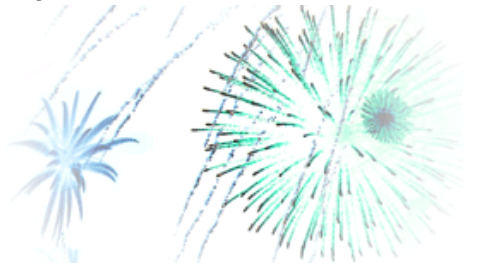

5 Irrefutable Staging Strategies



Homes that are properly staged almost always sell faster regardless of market conditions. If your home is on the market, be sure you follow these guidelines to keep your humble abode looking showroom perfect. Remember, beauty is in the eye of the buyer!

1 Cut the clutter. This is one of the easiest ways to give your home a “ready to buy” feel. 3 Curb appeal. You know the drill; first impressions are the most important. So when buyers first pull up to your home with their REALTOR®, they should see an inviting home with a great looking yard. 4 Touch-ups. Over the years, your home may have received a little wear and tear. It’s the mark of a lived-in home. Touch up molding and seams around the house with a fresh coat of paint.
